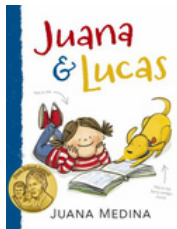


ENJOY A HISPANIC HERITAGE CHAPTER BOOK

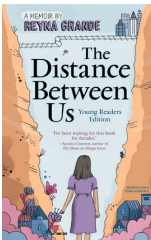
Total Eclipse of Nestor Lopez by Adrianna Cuevas
